

30	I think the option for parking like river falls is an accident waiting to happen and will cause traffic to be much worse with people having to try to park on both sides of the road. I think that option is also a nightmare for the street department for plowing in the winter
31	Option 1A seems to be the most sensible. Option 1-B seems really unsafe for vehicle/pedestrian conflicts. I don't think traffic will flow very well through here, especially if motorists have to constantly be on guard for opening doors and jaywalkers. Going from 4 lanes to 2 lanes is already a big change and people will complain (They complained all last year in Amery about the same type of change). If you slow traffic even more due to parking on both sides, I think people will be very upset about it. The trees in Option 1C could be nice, but issues with roots can cause the pavement and curb to crack prematurely unless proper trees are considered. Options 1B and 1C will take the crews twice as long to plow and pick up snow (unless it's going to be permanently stored in the boulevard all winter), and there isn't really an area to store snow on the street from plowing to pick-up.

What needs to be the priority is to slow traffic down and create safe crossings for visitors to come to our downtown. People do not feel safe when they try to cross the street. To many times we have witnessed someone almost getting hit. 78 Improved parking in front of Main St businesses is a must. 82 Do not put parking inside and outside. Outside is more than enough, not that many cars park on Main St. 84 No 85 Improving safety, for both pedestrians and motorists, should be the top priority for the Main Street redesign. As it stands, the Rice Lake Main Street is (I think?) the widest Main Street in WI: with six sizable vehicle lanes and needlessly large sidewalks. It is an ineffective use of valuable space. Wide driving lanes encourage drivers to go too fast (they think of them like highways), making it even more dangerous for pedestrians to cross our busy Main Street. Police officers are unable to move quickly through multiple lanes of traffic, making traffic control even more difficult! Kiddos, seniors, and those with mobility issues cannot cross safety in the time allotted by the crosswalks. The stoplights are not enough to slow down traffic; too often, the red lights are missed/ignored. Left turns on Main Street are treacherous too! A center boulevard will eliminate a majority of these major safety concerns: it signals "slow down" to motorists while offering a safe haven for pedestri 87 It needs a proper nice restaurant. Something fun to get people to want to go there and stay. And then lower the traffic. People drive so fast, and its really hard to see to pull out when cars are parked along it. 90 It will be important for the businesses that you have clearly defined and easy accessibility and parking during construction. Please do not make it too hard for our customers to get to us or for new customers to want to try to get to us. Have clearly marked directions for access and parking. 92 The speed limit needs to be slower. In the last 2 years, there have been numerous events and initiatives that have been rushed into, the communications to local businesses has not been complete, and/or the advertising did not run early enough or was missing information. While local businesses want to be supportive and improve downtown, their budgets aren't limitless. It is important to weigh the potential ROI vs the cost of the event or item. While all these things were put together with good intentions, changes do not happen overnight, and sometimes they need to happen more slowly. It would be prudent to make sure every angle has been considered, and enough time has been given for public input, before starting a very expensive project to make sure it is more likely to be successful.
